#### FEAP is a clear official representative of the sector with:

- 22 countries, 26 associations and federations, representing
  - 2,3 million tons of production

  - o Around €16 billion in added-value products
- More than 100 000 direct jobs rural/coastal
  - Not so far off 200 000 jobs when we include upstream and downstream sectors



# Conclusions of AiM 2012: Moving forward is everyone's job

- To develop the aquaculture sector, each of us has to be responsible for his own job:
  - At the European level
  - At the national level
  - At the producers level
  - At the research level
  - At the NGO's level



#### Main recommendations AiM 2013

- There is still a lot of work at the European and National levels
  - 5 priority areas: simplification of administration, spatial planning, competitiveness, Level Playing Field, Common fish health and welfare policies
  - We need clear and relevant indicators
  - Work to do for the creation of the Aquaculture Advisory Council.

- Confidence in our job with a positive approach (safety, feed, environmental issues, welfare)
