

# LUMIFA's weekly data and trends analysis

## Week 18

The fishing and aquaculture sectors are among the most consistently awarded to the state. LUMIFA is releasing a weekly LUMIFA Update in order to inform the sector as well as to provide an overview of the activities of the sector along the entire value chain, from the most upstream stage on fish sales, production and trade of farmed and aquaculture products. The data and analysis provided, in addition to LUMIFA's reports, have a multidisciplinary approach, combining a statistical and information-theoretical approach with a broader analysis of the current situation.



### WEEKLY PRODUCTION IN FISH SALES

In terms of production, weekly fish and aquaculture production data as reported in our publications are used as follows:

**2020** weekly averages of 100% of the opening (Wednesday) fish are a general step in fish sales data (between 2018 and 2019). The statistical system has a low level of accuracy. The data differ by approximately 10% in weight to national data, but a large part varies between 20% and 200%. The values for production are not representative.

In 2019, the **LUMIFA Update** is being revised and expanded to include developments in trade, fish sales, production and trade through data from the fish sales database. The sector has a low level of accuracy. The statistical system has a low level of accuracy. The data differ by approximately 10% in weight to national data, but a large part varies between 20% and 200%. The values for production are not representative.

In 2020, the data in 2019 is currently reported in week 18. A more detailed fish sales **summary** (including the development) is available since a 10% increase in volume and the decrease in price for 10 more species over week 17. The fish sales data and volume show that there is a clear increase in production and volume over the week, but the volume and weight are not reported for several fish species and species.

For the first week in 2020, the average price decreased in **fish sales** – Overall, the average price for fish sales is higher than last year. The average price for fish sales decreased by 10% and the average price by 10%. The average price of fish sales in the category of week 18 is mostly due to large fishings of cod, sea bass and salmon – The volume of fish sales is mostly due to the high volume of fish sales.
