Science, Action, Research and Legacy Celebrated at the 6th European Gender Studies Meeting in Stockholm

Brussels, May 27th 2013 - The European Institute for Gender Equality (EIGE) has its 6th Annual Gender Studies Meeting in Stockholm on May 27th 2013, featuring approximately 100 international scholars, practitioners, and experts from around Europe. The meeting is a day-long conference offering the latest research, policy analysis, and reflections on European Gender Policy.

EIGE's annual meeting is a meeting for action and dialogue. The theme of the European Gender Studies Meeting is a dialogue between the European Gender Studies in theory, practice, research, and education. This dialogue is a direct continuation of the European Gender Studies, a day-long meeting that took place in 1998 in Brussels, bringing together the then emerging field of gender studies, gender equality, and gender equality research under one roof. The European Gender Studies Meeting has continued annually, and has become the leading meeting in Europe for gender equality, gender studies, and gender research, and brings together practitioners, scholars, and activists from across Europe. The meeting will also mark 10 years since the European Gender Studies Meeting, the first meeting of a comparable and transnational European gender studies.

Gender studies and the European Gender Studies and Research are discussed in this meeting. These provide a basic entry to 2013 European Gender Policy, by comparing theoretical, methodological, substantive and theory research strategies on different issues with the future generation. The European Gender Studies Meeting covers the range of 2013 European Gender Equality Studies. It covers from individual to family and single gender issues.

Another priority theme will be European Studies on European Gender Studies Meeting. This concerns: gender and human rights for women and men and the population, and in the regions of Europe, and will focus on the most problematic and pressing that problems are. In addition, there are 10 other themes, which address the European Gender Studies Meeting, and the European Gender Studies Meeting.
